## **Membership Report-Gordon Fulton**

Gordon reported we are down to 108 members as of 2018 although some members had not renewed their membership yet. We have 14 US members.

Some from Eastern Canada have chosen to register only with the NFHR instead of the Canadian. We need to start doing more to attract younger members as our Fjord owner population is aging out at this time. We are not the only association running into this problem.

## **Advertising: Mikayla Murphy**

- 1. Number of farm advertisers on the website in 2017-12 only 1 corporate advertiser included in the above total and 1 ½ ad.
- 2. Newsletter advertising totals: Many of the newsletter ads were part of the website packages. Number of advertisers in the newsletter 10 in 2017. 2 full page colour ads for farms, 3 half page farm ads, 1-1/4 page black and white ads for farms and 4 business card ads.

One thing hopefully most of the members have seen is the Clinic Promotion Program. Members who meet the criteria, which includes supplying a short write up and photo for the newsletter, can be subsidized up to 6 clinics per year. At this time we have had no one take us up on this. In the 2017 year we saw a decrease in overall advertising. We have had some rebounds so far with the renewals and hope to see it continue to increase which helps pay for our newsletter.

### **Newsletter-Darlene Turner**

Unfortunately Darlene was not able to attend but Aja presented her report.

Darlene needs more help with content such as articles, pictures, recipes and experiences with members horses. She has done a wonderful job taking on the the newsletter from retired Jane and we all really appreciate all the hard work she has put into it. Linda suggested maybe looking at older issues for content and Aja said she would talk to Jane and see if she had them on file for Darlene to look at as there may be some articles that could be recycled. Other horse groups have seen our newsletter and are becoming interested in it. So it looks like it is still a viable resource for keeping in touch with our members. We need more advertising to be able to financially afford to keep it going in future years. Linda had a suggestion that we have members take our newsletter on holidays with them and show it with a picture of where they are. We could call it Where in the World is CFHA?


#### PayPal:

Income from 2017: \$1,416 which was down 35% from 2016 year (\$2,179). Some of this has been made up in the past few months of 2018. We did have a number of newsletter only subscriptions in 2017 which we have not seen in 2018, reminder notices have been sent with the March 2018 newsletter.

Transactions and payments made by paypal was up 13% Year over Year.

Fees paid in 2017: \$49.24 was paid in fees for the 2017 year.

## **By-Law changes-Gordon**

Gordon explained the need for the two changes we presented to clean up wording in them. The first one is on blood-typing which is no longer done. We are changing the wording to DNA testing.

The second one was on the pedigree committee which we want to change to the President of the CFHA.

Greg made a motion to present these changes to the Department of Agriculture and Mikayla seconded it and all were in favor.

Suggestions or issues anyone would like to bring up at this time-

Gordon mentioned he is dealing a lot with people trying to register horses and though it is up to the seller to transfer the animals to the new owner. This seems not to be happening quite frequently which causes a problem in the new owner registering, if they do not have all the information they need to register. Gordon said he would put something in the newsletter to remind people on how to do these sales.

Gordon thanked Aja for the long term she has put in the association and all her hard work on keeping us going. Dayna was not able to attend the meeting but we also wanted to say we really appreciated all the work she has done as a director in promoting the breed.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Anna at 2:06 and Greg seconded it and All were in favor.
